

eHealth Ontario's Recent Accomplishments

- Neuro trauma patients, including stroke victims, now have access to a neuro specialist 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- More than 20,000 neuro consultations have been made remotely saving taxpayers millions of dollars thanks to the Emergency Neuro Image Transfer System (ENITS).
- Doctors now receive hospital reports into their Electronic Health Records faster than ever. It takes 30 minutes to transfer hospital reports digitally, versus the approximate 12 days it used to take.
- Ontario physicians receive 500,000 hospital reports into their EHR system every month. This helps avoid hospital re-administrations and reduces patient wait times.
- There are over 3,000 types of lab results that can be accessed through physicians' EHRs.
- More than 325,000 vulnerable citizens benefit from EHRs at community health centres.
- The Ontario laboratories information system (OLIS) is capable of storing up to 45,000 unique types of test results.
- Currently, there are over 2.9 billion results in OLIS representing 9.5 million Ontarians. OLIS contains 96 per cent of community lab results and 70 per cent of the total lab results in the province.
- Now, 100 per cent of hospital sites can share diagnostic images and reports digitally within their region.
- The medication history of all Ontario seniors is accessible to health care providers in all hospitals and emergency rooms.
